

1. Page 65, Sect L-13.9: Table 1 lists a 10 slide limit for Management Approach (Organization and Staffing Plan) and a 5 slide limit for Facilities. If the Facilities information could be presented in less than 5 slides, would the government allow the unused slide allotment from the Facilities section to be applied to another proposal area, such as Management Approach?

An offeror's unused slide allotment cannot be used on another topic.

2. Page 128, Sect M-3.1.1: Can the government confirm that only the prime's facility must be located within a 25 mile radius of the Old Town campus?

Only the prime contractor's facility must be within a 25 mile radius of Old Town campus.

3. Page 75, Sect L-16.3: Can the government provide an indication of the percentages of contractor-site and government-site LOE for purposes of cost proposal development?

The offeror must provide recommendations in its proposal that address adequate support to fulfill the statement of objectives. Using performance based principles, the offeror's management approach should include an organization plan that is designed to achieve the objectives of the contract SOO. The offeror should discuss and justify its proposed percentage of government-site versus contractor-site requirements.

4. Page 11, When can we expect to receive Section B-3, Determination and Payment of Base and Award Fee?

The Government intends to post this section by COB 5/13/04.

5. Page 65, Section L-13.8 indicates that one CD should be submitted. The table in section L-13.9 indicates separate CDs should be provided, one per volume. Which is correct?

One CD per volume should be submitted. L-13.9 will be corrected.

6. Page 70, L-16.1.5.3: (Electronics Engineer III) Can a Masters Degree in Electrical Engineering or Computer Science be used in lieu of a Bachelor's Degree of the same? (For example, an individual has a Bachelor's Degree in Business/Economics and a Masters Degree in Computer Science.)

A Bachelor's Degree is the minimum level needed to satisfy the requirement, and can be replaced by a higher degree.

7. Page 78, L16.4.2: (3) states that the proposal is valid for 180 calendar days, but the SF33, block 12 states 210 calendar days, please clarify.

Offerors' proposals will be valid for 210 days. L-16.4.2 will be corrected.
